## Introduction

Barnet Council's Adult Social Care services provide a wide range of services for people of all ages with a visual loss.

Rehabilitation Workers and Access Enablement Officers based in the Sensory Impairment Team focus on supporting people who are severely sight impaired (blind), sight impaired (partially sighted) or Deafblind.

The specialist workers can provide information, advice and support to any resident who has a significant visual loss.

Their aim is to help you understand your particular sight problem and work with you and your family, to find the best way of enabling you to maintain your independence and overcome some of the difficulties you may be experiencing.

If you have a visual impairment and live in the London Borough of Barnet, or know someone who does, this booklet gives you information about the services available to you.

## What we can offer:

- An assessment of your needs
- Advice and information on local and national support and activity groups
- Advice and information on benefits
- Advice on employment issues
- Life skills training to enable you to continue to be independent within your home
- Mobility training to enable you to travel independently and safely outside your home
- Advice on how to overcome communication difficulties
- Low vision and lighting assessment to help you make the most of any residual vision you may have
- Advice on equipment and adaptations
- Advice on other social care services
- Advice on registration

## Registration

If you have poor sight then it is a good idea to think about visiting your GP or Optician. This can help you get the practical support you need.

To register you will need to be certified as sight impaired (partially sighted) or severely sight impaired (blind) by a consultant ophthalmologist (eye specialist). If you are already attending an eye hospital or clinic, you should discuss certification with your specialist or you might prefer to talk it over with a hospital social worker first. Otherwise, you should ask your GP to refer you to a consultant ophthalmologist.

## There are two categories of registration:

- 1. Sight Impaired (partially sighted)
- 2. Severely Sight Impaired (blind)

Being registered as severely sight impaired does not necessarily mean that you are totally blind or that you will become so. There are many degrees of visual loss.

The Sensory Impairment Team keeps a confidential register of sight impaired (partially sighted) or severely sight impaired (blind) people living in the London Borough of Barnet. This register helps us to find out what types of services people with sight problems need.

## Registration is voluntary, and you do not need to be registered to receive a service.

## Health benefits

If you need 'complex lenses' you may qualify for a voucher towards the cost of glasses (check with your optician whether you are eligible).

You can get help with NHS costs, including vouchers towards the costs of glasses and free NHS sight tests, if you receive Income Support, Guaranteed Pension Credit or income-based Jobseeker's Allowance, or if you have a low income. You are also entitled to free eye tests if you are aged 40 or over, and your mother, father, brother, sister, son or daughter has been diagnosed with glaucoma or you been advised by an ophthalmologist (eye doctor) that you are at risk of glaucoma.

## Counselling

If you require professional help coming to terms with your visual loss, you GP can refer you for counselling sessions.

## **Benefit information**

If you are registered as severely sight impaired (blind) or sight impaired (partially sighted) you are not automatically entitled to any welfare benefits, and there is no special benefit or pension for people with a serious sight loss. However, severely sight impaired (blind) and sight impaired (partially sighted) people - depending on age and other circumstances - may be able to claim one or more welfare benefits.

#### **Attendance Allowance**

If you are over 65 years old and need supervision or help with personal care because of an illness or disability, then you may be entitled to claim Attendance Allowance. You can get Attendance Allowance even if you live alone, if no one is giving you help, or even if you would not accept any help.

## **Personal Independence Payment (PIP)**

Personal Independence Payment (PIP) is replacing Disability Living Allowance (DLA) for people with long-term health condition or disability aged 16-64.

PIP is usually paid every 4 weeks. It is tax free and you can get it whether you are in or out of work. How much you get is not based on your condition, but how your condition affects you. You will need to have an assessment to work out the level of help you get. Your award will be regularly reassessed to make sure you're getting the right support.

## **Carer's Allowance**

If someone such as your partner, a relative or friend spends time looking after you, they may get Carer's Allowance, and / or the carer premium in income-based benefits. Even if you are visually impaired you may get one or both of these for looking after another person, for example, your partner. The person being cared for must be getting either Attendance Allowance or the middle or highest rate care component of Disability Living Allowance.

## **Employment and Support Allowance**

Both Incapacity Benefit and Income Support paid to people who cannot work because of an illness or disability have been replaced by a new benefit called Employment and Support Allowance. If you are already receiving Incapacity Benefit or Income Support when the new benefit is introduced you will continue to receive these benefits. Employment and Support Allowance will only be paid to new claimants.

#### **Income Tax**

If you are registered as severely sight impaired (blind) you may be entitled to an additional personal allowance before paying Income Tax. You will need to contact the local Revenue and Customs Department on:

Articles for the Blind is a service offered by Royal Mail for people who are registered as sight impaired. It allows specified letters and parcels to be sent first class post, free of charge. ## Leisure concessions

Concessions are available to people who are registered, or people receiving certain benefits, for various leisure and recreational activities. For example, you may get a free ticket for the person accompanying you to participating cinemas, reduced price entry to museums and exhibitions and concessions from local libraries when taking out audio books and DVDs. Check locally about availability of concessions and take with you proof of your registration.

## Help getting around

## Freedom Pass

A Freedom Pass gives people free travel on buses, trains, trams, tubes and Docklands Light Rail services in London. It is paid for by your local council to help older and disabled people get around. If you are registered with a visual impairment or are over 60 you can apply for a freedom pass.

## North London Dial-a-Ride

Dial-a-Ride is a door-to-door multi-occupancy vehicle for disabled and older people who cannot use buses, trains and tubes. It can be used for many different journeys, for example shopping, visiting friends and family, doctor and dentist appointments and going out at night. If you are registered severely sight impaired (blind) or sight impaired (partially sighted), you are eligible to receive the service.

- Visit you at home to carry out home safety and security checks, benefits checks and income maximisation
- Advise on the scope of adaptations or repairs, draw up plans and specifications and make applications for planning and building control permissions
- Assist in applying for available grants or other funding to pay for the work
- Help in obtaining estimates from reliable builders supervising works and arranging for payments to be made.
