Finance Portal

We have made changes to how you access the portal to look at your payments. The link has stayed the same:

https://csproviderportal.barnet.gov.uk

Enter your email and password and then you will be asked to set up a 6-digit passcode.

You will then be asked to set up a security code:

- The code should be 6 digits long
- Using 0-9 numerical characters
- You cannot use the same digit more than 4 times
- No sequences of more than 3 consecutive digits so you will not be allowed to enter 123456 or 654321

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Barnet Virtual School - PEPs

Personal Educational Plans are anything is possible essential tools improving Educational outcomes for the pupils in the Virtual School. They are a termly opportunity to discuss any barriers to learning, strengths and challenges to share how well a child is doing academically and socially and to write a robust Action Plan to plan for future progress. It is vital that Foster Carers play an active role in the meetings and the decisions that are made in the Action Plan which follows.

A PEP meeting usually takes place in the Education Setting and should be Person Centred. It can happen at the same time as a LAC review or Statement Review as long as the relevant paperwork is completed.

Barnet Virtual School uses an EPEP supplied by Welfare Call which is an external portal. Due to the security measures around the portal we are unable to allow Foster Carers to have direct access to the document. The document can be printed and it is reasonable to ask for a copy of the Action Plan from the school or education setting, at the end of the meeting. It is the task of the child's Social worker to collect the views of the Foster Carer before the meeting. The sections on the form are

broad and ask that you are as detailed as possible so at the meeting there is all of the relevant information to make the best plan for the student:

- What you like and admire about the child/young person
- What are their current strengths/interests/talents inside and outside of school (subjects, clubs, activities, Aim Higher)?
- What else do we need to know about? (Views and wishes of carers/barriers to learning)?
- Significant changes since the last PEP

This is a great opportunity to let the school know your child's strengths.

At the PEP meeting previous targets need to be reviewed and at least 75% of the meeting should be planning for Educational progress during the following term based on previous educational attainment and progress and any identified barriers to learning.

It is at the PEP meeting that everyone decides on the best use of Pupil Premium in order to meet the identified targets. The Virtual School is responsible for administering Pupil Premium and we will only sanction what is written in a PEP. We generally give £500 per term per child. The yearly allowance is £1900 and we keep some back for our "high level needs" students who may need expensive alternative provisions. However, there is an opportunity at a PEP meeting to request additional funding, which will always be considered.

Pupil Premium Plus is to improve the educational outcomes for children in care. Therefore, requests for interventions, one-one tuition, laptops will usually be successful. Strategies to overcome barriers to learning or raise attainment especially in English and maths will be received favourably.

It is not for school trips or Breakfast/After school clubs or travel to school – unless this is specifically meeting a Social and emotional need which has been identified in the rest of the PEP. The Head or Deputy Head of the Virtual School Quality Assure all PEPs so each child's needs are analysed before decisions are made.

We hope the PEP meeting is a real opportunity for you to advocate for your child/young person and plan with their Social Worker and school to improve their educational outcomes and therefore life chances.

Registering Online

Before you can register online you will need an email address:

- Register your admissions at www.eadmissions.org.uk
- You will be sent an email with your login details
- Make a note of your username and password

Beginning Your Application

You are now ready to start your application:

- Login to your account
- This will take you to the "My school admissions" homepage
- Select 'Start Application for New Child' and follow the on-screen instructions
- Have your council tax reference number ready as you will need to provide it

Submitting Your Application

The closing date for applications is 31st October 2017.

When you have added your child's details and school preferences:

- Use the 'save and continue' button to continue to the 'Check and Submit' page
- Check all the details entered on your application
- Complete your application by using the 'Submit Application' button

- Once you have submitted your application successfully you will be taken to a 'Confirmation' page and you will also be sent a confirmation email with a summary of your application
- Make a note of your application reference number

Health – Cervical Cancer Injections

All girls aged 12 to 13 are offered HPV (human papilloma virus) vaccination as part of the NHS childhood vaccination programme.

The vaccine protects against cervical cancer. It's usually given to girls in year eight at schools in England.

The HPV vaccine is delivered largely through secondary schools, and consists of two injections into the upper arm spaced at least six, and not more than 24 months apart (girls who began vaccination before September 2014 receive three injections).

Permissions are needed for this injection and it should be advised that a discussion with the child's social worker needs to take place as well as the child.
